

Introduction to Oil Painting- RoseMarie Condon

Materials List

A good quality student set of oil paints. Buy what you can afford.

3 or 4 8" x10" stretched canvasses or painting panels

In all cases purchase the best you can afford.

I would not recommend paints, canvasses or painting panels from any of the dollar stores.

Nylon or Taklon brushes #4, #8 Flats, #2 Filbert, #2 Round will get you started,

Palette paper (sold in pads), a Palette, or Styrofoam plate to use and toss.

Small palette knife – for mixing paint.

Small sketchbook, pencils and eraser.

Turpenoid (used as brush cleaner and medium)

Solid container (jar with lid) to hold brush cleaner (Turpenoid)

Paper towels & small plastic bags for your table garbage

Saran or plastic wrap to wrap brushes for transporting to home.

Optional supplies:

Latex or non-latex gloves

Barrier cream for skin protection

Small colour wheel

Painting apron or smock

Package of baby wipes for quick clean-ups

Painting apron or smock

Oil Colours:

Oil set should contain warm and cool versions of red, blue, yellow. Earth tones burnt sienna, burnt or raw umber as well as white.

A larger tube of titanium white is also useful.
